Synopsis

Expected Outcomes

By the end of the knowledge sharing session, participants should:

- Understand how innovation can be systematically commercialised within local government.
- Have a better understanding and appreciation of the legislative instruments MFMA and MSA provisions.
- Identify potential revenue-generating opportunities within their municipalities.
- Gain practical knowledge on frameworks for innovation commercialisation.
- Establish a network of peers for ongoing support and collaboration.

Segment 1: Protocol and Opening Remarks

This segment will focus on protocol, during which leaders from the hosting entities will officially welcome participants and set the tone for the programme. They will also provide a high-level situational analysis of their respective institutions, particularly in relation to innovation and the adoption of innovative opportunities. The keynote speaker will share relevant insights, trends, and anecdotes aligned with the overall theme of the workshop.

Segment 2: Innovation Showcases and Lived Experiences

This segment takes a two-pronged approach showcasing ongoing innovation pilots while allowing innovators to share their lived experiences in implementing their solutions. The format will feature:

- Students currently placed within the Community and Social Development Department sharing their journey thus far.
- City employees from Team MATVS reflecting on their experiences; and
- Entrepreneurs (both emerging and established), such as WHC and Groovetech, share their innovation journeys.

Segment 3: Reflections and Leadership Dialogue

This session will build on the experiences shared by the innovators, exploring potential actions and interventions that municipalities could adopt to support innovation. It will also

encourage leaders to discuss how they can drive institutional reform to facilitate the easier adoption of innovative practices.

Segment 4: Plenary and Closing Reflections

The final segment will follow a two-pronged approach. First, participants will be invited to contribute inputs and reflections on the discussions. Thereafter, a senior City official will deliver a high-level reflection on the programme, highlighting key issues and potential action points for follow-up.
